Pandemic sex: Queer Spaces and Future Intimacies

In this workshop we invite participants to reflect on the ways COVIDrelated measures have impacted on queer practices of intimacy in different spaces.

For extended periods during the pandemic, restrictions effectively confined intimacy to the nuclear household. At the same time, the closure of venues such as bars, clubs, and saunas led many people to seek out alternative spaces in which to gather, socialise and have sex. These included online spaces, in-person private parties as well as outdoor gatherings in public space.

In a city where sex-positive infrastructures are unevenly distributed, these trends have generated a series of questions and tensions around contemporary sexual citizenship and space that we explore in this workshop.
